

New Year - New Things

2017... the beginning of a new year. This year I resolve not to talk about resolutions in this article. Note: this resolution is only good for 2017.

But, it is a new year. And, in taking down last year's calendar and putting up a new one, we might feel inclined to think about other "new things." How about a new image of God? "Thanks for the suggestion chap, but I am quite comfortable with the image I currently hold of God."

It is true that we can certainly have a *sure* word about God. It is just as certain that we don't have the *last* word about God. Let's venture to say that it would tend to be on the side of arrogance and absolutism to believe that we have God all figured out, that we have a complete picture or image of God.

What I am asking you to do is to be an *iconoclast*. If you've seen either of the "My Big Fat Greek Wedding" movies, you will recall the patriarch of the family claiming all words are of Greek origins. "Iconoclast" actually is: "*eikon*" meaning "image" - and "*klastes*" meaning "breaker" - literally "image breaker"; however, "idol breaker" would be a better understanding.

We each have an image of God, shaped by readings (the Bible and other literature, both fiction and non-fiction), Bible studies, sermons, conversations we've been part of, the life of Christ, even possibly personal revelations to you of God's nature. Each of these fills in a bit of your understanding of God, and collectively they work together to form an image. And this image is at once a benefit - and a hinderance. For the image of a given instant, helpful as it may be, begins to compete against our having a growing understanding of God.

I'm not asking you to throw out all that you think you understand of God. I am asking that you be open to - *NO* - that you <u>seek</u> an ever expanding image of God! Let us never fall into the trap of thinking we, the finite, have a handle on God, the infinite.

I had a housemate early after graduate school who had a very attractive girlfriend that drove a bright red Corvette. She did a fair amount of the maintenance on the car herself and had a saying: "A woman's mind is a lot like motor oil - if it isn't changed frequently, it gets all gummy and sludgy." To keep us from holding a "gummy and sludgy" image of God, we need to let God knock down the walls of the temple we have built for him and/or burst open the box we try to place him in.

In this new year, may we be open to growing our image of God, of being an iconoclast and not letting the image we hold of God become an idol. We just celebrated the birth of Christ, of God incarnate walking among us for the purpose of revealing God's self to us. God always desires to give more of himself to us. May we let this happen: letting a full-color image grow from our current gray-scale understanding, letting the resolution of the picture we have of God blossom from a grainy image to one that is vibrant and full of detail, and allowing depth and motion to come into what was the flat picture we had been holding onto. Seek the new(er) image of God.
